

BISBEE FOOT BALL TEAM DOWNS TUCSON

One touchdown, a safety and a field goal by Hoesch, all tallied in the first half, enabled Bisbee High school to close its football season with a well earned victory. In figures, it was 10 to 0.

Tucson proved something of a surprise and according to the local boys they have improved about 100 per cent since Bisbee met them on their home grounds earlier in the season. Capt. Proctor, left half for the visitors, was practically the whole show, breaking up some of Bisbee's plays back of the line and making most of his team's gains. Had they all put up a game like Proctor's, the result might have been another story.

But that detracts nothing from the credit which belongs to the home boys. "Biddy" Doyle, Jr., got his first chance at a regular position, and the game he put up at right guard, specially in the first half, won cheers from the spectators as he broke through Tucson's line time and time and again and got his man, breaking up their plays. Beaton, too at tackle, was onto his job every minute, and spoiled Tucson's only chance for a touchdown by a brilliant tackle near the sidelines, after Proctor had got by everybody else with the ball.

Doyle, by the way, seems likely to develop into a crackerjack at catching punts. Every chance he had yesterday, one of them a difficult forward pass, he was "Johnny on the spot," getting the ball on the particular occasion mentioned for a 25-yard gain.

The second half was more of a kicking duel and honors were about evenly divided in distance gaining. In this half Proctor was laid out after a collision with Walter O'Malley, but pluckily resumed play after about a ten-minute intermission to give him time to recuperate. Bisbee's goal was threatened seriously but once, in the second half, and from that it was easy sailing. The forward pass and on-side kick were the reliable gainers. Bisbee got away with a neat run around right end on one occasion. Tucson once tried a fake kick formation but they didn't do it again, for the simple reason that Bisbee's linemen were right onto them and threw Simons for a loss. Every trick that Tucson attempted was neatly blocked at every stage.

The refereeing of Bright, of Bisbee, demonstrated some interpretations of rules to Tucson that they were inclined to argue about at times, but readily gave in when shown they were wrong. Altogether, it was a clean exhibition of football, with no attempts at roughness which predominated in the Douglas game.

Twenty-five and twenty minute halves were played. Tucson returned Bisbee's kick off ten yards. Bisbee promptly held for downs on Tucson's 30 yard line. John O'Malley failed to gain. Bisbee then punted back of Tucson's goal and Sam Benton fell on the ball for a safety. Score, Bisbee 2, Tucson 0.

An exchange of punts followed, then Tucson, after a ten-yard buck, kicked behind Bisbee's goal, but Bisbee got the ball for a touchback. Bisbee kicked off and it was Tucson's ball on Bisbee's 40-yard line. Tucson gained a yard and then a forward pass went wrong. Bisbee's ball on their own 30-yard line. Bisbee punted and the Tucson man went down in his tracks on his own 30-yard line. They tried a forward pass. Simons threw the ball where his own man wasn't. Beaton picked it up and raced back across the goal for the only touchdown of the game.

Bisbee kicked out, but the kick was fumbled. Score: Bisbee 7, Tucson 0.

An argument ensued as to an interpretation of the rules on this play. Tucson held that Bisbee had no right to touch the ball, but as a Tucson man was nowhere in front of it their protest was overruled.

Tucson kicked off. Bisbee returned 5 yards. Doyle got Hoesch's onside for a 25-yard gain. Tucson penalized 5 yards for off-side. Bucks and another onside kick, again gobbled by Doyle, put the ball on Tucson's 20 yard line. Hoesch made the season's final points with a field goal. Score: Bisbee 10, Tucson 0.

Bisbee returned Tucson's kick 15 yards and punted back in return. Tucson thrown for a loss of three yards by Beaton, back of the line. Bisbee returned Tucson's punt 10 yards and Tucson brought their return punt back 5 yards when time was called.

In the second half Tucson's kick-off was brought back 20 yards. Tucson fell on the ball on an attempted on-side kick on their own 50-yard line. A forward pass went wrong and Simons was thrown for a five-yard loss. An exchange of punts followed with no material advantage either way. With the ball in Tucson's possession on Bisbee's 50 yard line Proctor went through the line for a spectacular 20-yard plunge, a pretty play. Bucking carried the ball to Bisbee's 20-yard line, the only time the goal was seriously threatened. Then Proctor made the mistake of punting instead of taking his men on through the line. Bisbee got the punt back on the line and kicked out. Punts were again exchanged and then a Tucson onside went away and the ball bounded back to their own 20 yard line where Tucson recovered. They immediately punted out of danger. After Bisbee had line-bucked for ten years, Proctor was laid out and was first thought to be seriously hurt, but the wind had only been temporarily knocked from his body and he soon was ready to resume play.

Walter O'Malley made 15 yards on a run around right end. Line plunges gained five and the ball went over on downs. Bisbee held Tucson first down and threw them for a loss. An onside kick netted 30 yards, then they were held one down. Proctor hit the line for 10 and then Bisbee got the ball on an attempted forward

pass. Bisbee could not gain and the ball went over. On a fake kick formation Simons was thrown for a 5-yard loss. Tucson punted and Bisbee returned 5 yards. An onside failed and Tucson, recovering, immediately tried a forward pass good for 15 yards. They gained 5 through the line and were held. Tucson punted and Bisbee returned four yards. Bisbee's ball on the 40-yard line. They negotiated a 20-yard forward pass, which John O'Malley got neatly, when time was called.
